

# Roman Emperors & Julius Caesar:

## Julius Caesar: Julius Ceasar

- Born July 100 BC, Rome, Italy
- Stabbed to DEATH March 15, 44 BC, Rome, Italy
- Quaestor: kind of like a Ancient Roman accountant
- Curule aedile: responsible for maintaining the city and keeping the people entertained [65 BC]
- Pontifex maximus: chief priest of Rome [65 BC]
- Praetor: dual role as military leader and judge [62 BC]
- Consul: one of the two leaders of Rome who worked to gether like co-presidents [59 BC]
- Dictator for life: exactly the way it is written
- Caesar was known for conquering Gaul in a amazing campaign which is still used for research for training generals today. His victories in Gaul brought the empire what should later become one of the most important territories to the empire



## **Augustus Caesar:**

**Date of birth** - September 23rd in Rome Italy 63 BC

Father - Gaius Octavius

Mother - Atia Balba Caesonia

**Period of time ruling** - 27 BC to 14 AD (41 years)

**Accomplishments** - first emperor of Rome, brought peace to Rome after Caesar's death, created a sophisticated currency, developed an effective postal system, served as princeps of the senate for 40 years, increase the population of Rome from 4,063,000 to 4,937,000, built many architectural marvels, built many architectural marvels.

**Legacy** - first emperor of Rome, behind many architectural marvels.

**Death** - August 1914 AD in Nola Italy from natural causes



## **Claudius:**

name/birthday: his full name is Tiberius Claudius Drusus

He was born on August 1 10 BC he was born in Lugdunum

Period of the time he ruled: He ruled for 13 years, which isn't very long.

Accomplishments: most believed he was mentally handicapped, he also had no military experience, because of his mental health his family hid him from the public because they were

embarrassed by him. The praetorians found him behind a curtain and took him to there camp and the troops hailed him emperor.

Death:he died on October 13th, 54CE. The Romans were convinced that his wife Agrippina poisoned him. He was 63 when he died.



**Trajan:**

September 18, 53AD and died on August 8th 117 AD.

He came from Spain and was emperor 98 to 117 AD

He died of a stroke and was famous for being Spanish and also served in a syria military



**Nero:**

Nero Claudius Caesar Augustus Germanicus

Born December 15, 37 in Antium , Italy

Died June 9, 68

Ruled from October 13, 54 - June 9, 68

Known for the story that he fiddled while Rome burned in a great fire  
Achievements- Nero ordered his mothers death, he spent excess amounts of government funds on personal indulgences, The great fire open for 10 days and decimated 75% of Rome

**Tiberius:**

Born- 16 November 42 BC,Rome

Died- 16 March 37 AD

Accomplishments- People in Rome really liked him because he cut taxes and also cut luxury spending. While this all sounds nice, he was also disliked for many of his failures. He improved civil service, and healed rome's financial issue. Served from 14 AD to 37 AD, One of his children was Julius Caesar.

August 31, Anzio, Italy

3 years, 10 months

Name: Lucius Septimius Bassianus

Died: April 8, 217 AD

Born: April 4, 188 AD

Accomplishments: he made the Caracalla baths

Time he Ruled: 2 years

**Hadrian:**

Full name: Publius Aelius Hadrianus Buccallanus

Birthplace: Italica, Spain

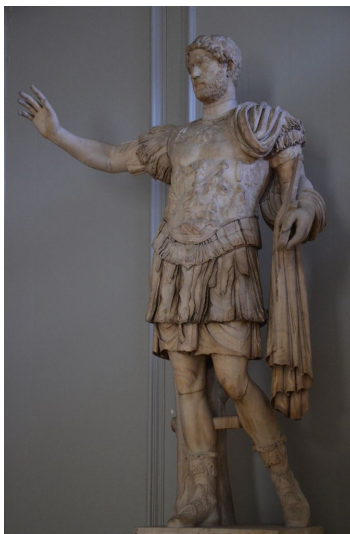
Birthday: Jan. 24th, 76 AD

Period of time he ruled: 117-138 AD

Accomplishments: he was the first Emperor that wasn't focused on expanding his empire but defending it

Legacy: He improved the Empire's defence

Death: July 10th 138 AD, Baiae, Italy



**Vespasian:**

Name- Titus Flavius Caesar Vespasianus Augustus

Ruled- 69 AD-79 AD

Birth- November 17, 9 AD in Falacrine

Death- June 23, 79 AD in Rieti, Italy

Predecessor- Vitellius

House- Flavian dynasty

Structures- Colosseum

Children- Titus, Domitian, Domitilla

He found the Flavian dynasty that ruled for over 27 years. He was from an equestrian family that rose into the senatorial rank under the Julio-Claudian emperors.
