Sara and Althea from SHIFT. (Sexual Health & Intimacy for Teens)

The uterus is normally the size of a fist but can stretch up to 500 times its original size.

An egg (or eggs in the case of twins) is/are released every month and once released it only lives 24 - 48 hours.

Vagina is also called the birth canal.

Menstruation is when the uterus' wall is shed.

Men are fertile for their entire life.

When men ejaculate, they release between 40-million to 1.2 billion sperm

A sperm can survive 5 – 6 days inside a woman's body.

Sex:

Sex is best when it is with someone who you are in a trusting and safe relationship.

Sexual Integrity – not using your sexual power to misuse other people or ourselves.

Sex is a serious responsibility.

- Women can get pregnant even when using contraception.

Contraception: Reduces risks of pregnancy

- Spermicide 72%
- Male condom 82%
- Female condom 79%
- Withdrawal (pulling out) 78%
- Sponge 88% 76%
- Injectable 94%
- Pill 91%
- Patch 91%
- Ring 91%
- Diaphragm 88%
- Implant 99.95%
- IUD (Intrauterine Device) 99.8% 99.2%
- Male Sterilization 99.85%
- Female Sterilization 99.5%

STIs - Sexually Transmitted Infections

- Bacterial: chlamydia, gonorrhea and syphilis

- Parasitic: trichomoniasis

Sexual Addiction:

Having sex increases Dopamine Levels by 150%

Sex also releases oxytocin which helps create bonds between people.

Pornography:

- Research indicates that the average person is exposed to pornography by the age of 8 years old.
- It causes people to treat others as an object as opposed to seeing them as a valued person.
- Can lead to reduced levels of intimacy between partners

Age of consent:

- For sexual activity is 16 years old.
- Your consent is required for any sexual activity.
- Sexting: If you are under the age of 18 it is illegal to send or receive nude photos.

Decision Making: to help plan what type of relationships you want to be involved in.

- Setting priorities
- Organizing plans and ideas
- Forming strategies
- Controlling impulses
- Allocating attention

Saying "No"

If you can't say "No" to someone that you are in a relationship with, then that is a red flag. You should always be able to say "No" to someone who trusts, values and cares about you.
